Community safety engagement in Barrow schools

Please find this as a quick update to what has been happening at Barrow over the last few weeks regarding community safety.

All watches have been heavily involved in summer activities with Watch Manager Michael Bradshaw and Watch Manager Simon Rodger organising sport in schools engagement sessions. The crews have attended several schools in the area to firstly play sport – in this case cricket and rounders – followed by the pupils asking questions about the fire service. We also gave them fire safety advice.





The days coincided with hot weather and on each session the squirting of the hose ended in a cooling water fight for the students, teachers and ourselves! Everyone involved has thoroughly enjoyed the sessions and more are planned over the coming months.

The Unity Festival proved a huge hit in Barrow town centre as crews started with a parade through the town with approximately 100 others waving flags from different countries of the world.

Arts and crafts as well as different European and Asian food was served at the town hall. The Unity Festival coincided with the hottest day of the year so the hose came off again as children and adults danced to live music from different corners of the globe while being showered with water. Everyone loved being cooled off, learning about the fire service and accepting fire safety advice.

Annual Benefits Statements 2024–25

Annual Benefit Statements and Remediable Service Statements (ABS-RSS) for 2024–25 are due to be released on or before **Sunday**, **31 August 2025**.

The quickest and simplest way for you to receive your ABS-RSS is on LPPA's online portal – PensionPoint

Access to the pension portal to register for an account can be found here:

PensionPoint - Log in to your LPPA online portal - Home

On registration, LPPA ask that you: "Please use a **personal email address** (rather than a work one) in case you move employers or retire."

In the lead up to the ABS-RSS being released we will be providing information around "contribution adjustments" and will carry out a presentation on "understanding your ABS-RSS".
