I Gel Supraglottic airways withdrawn from use

Due to the service adopting the IEC one-day course, we will be withdrawing the I Gel Supraglottic airways from use.

The Supraglottic airways are classed as an advanced airway so cannot be included in the one-day course.

We can however teach and use O/P and N/P airways (Oral and Nasal) which can be used in conjunction with bag valve and mask ventilation.

We will still follow the Algorithm V12.

Can all crews remove Supraglottic airways from IEC kits and send back to stores via internal mail please.

Technical service notice - Reciprocating cutting blades

Please note there are two types of reciprocating saw blades available for use:

1. Training and general use:

Milwaukee Sawzall - "The Wrecker"



Colour: White

Sizes: 150mm and 300mm

• Use: Training and operational tasks

2. RTC specialist cutting (operational use only):

Bosch Expert - Vehicle Rescue



• Colour: Blue

• **Sizes:** 150mm & 225mm

• Use: RTC (Road Traffic Collision) and specialist cutting only

Issuing procedure:

- To ensure service availability, a maximum of two blades of each type per ticket will be issued
- Blades are only available from Stores via the ticket system
